ANIMALS AND HUMAN HEALTH BENEFITS

Why Pet Owners are a Healthy Breed

There is a wonderful body of evidence that has been accumulated over the years that dramatically proves that our pets are good for our health! As a rule, our pets (especially dogs) keep pet owners much more active that non-pet owners and this has obvious positive health consequences.

- A study among elderly individuals with and without pets found that individuals who owned pets and were experiencing stressful life events reported significantly fewer contacts with doctors than those without pets.
- One study reported a reduction in minor health problems during the first month after pet acquisition. For dog owners, this effect was sustained throughout the study and suggests that pets may influence perceptions of stress.
- A UCLA study found that dog owners required much less medical care for stress induced aches and pains versus those who did not own dogs.
- City Hospital in New York found that heart patients who owned pets had a significantly higher survival rate than those patients who did not own a pet.
- Pet owners with AIDS have less depression and reduced stress compared to non-pet owners with AIDS. Pets are a major source of support and increase a patient's perception of the ability to cope with illness.
- Infants exposed to pets during their first year of life have a lower frequency of allergies and asthma.

- 70% of families surveyed reported an increase in family happiness and fun after acquiring a pet.
- One study indicated that, on average, pet owners have lower blood pressure and lower levels of triglycerides than non-pet owners. Additionally, this study indicated that just ten (10) minutes in the company of an animal significantly reduces one's blood pressure.
- Pets dramatically help alleviate loneliness and one of the most damaging risk factors for people recovering from heart disease and other ailments is loneliness. This may be the reason why pet owners who suffer from heart attacks are likely to have five times the survival rate of patients who do not own pets!
- Positive self-esteem and advanced cognitive development is more likely in children if there is a pet in the home.

We could go on for several more pages listing the dramatic positive impact that pets have on our lives. Those of us that own pets understand this but the impressive findings of various studies reinforces our understanding. We strongly encourage you to share this information with your non-pet owning family members and friends. Studies don't lie! Pets are good for our mental, emotional and physical health - it's that simple.

Additionally, pet owners should not look upon the expense associated with pet ownership as a cost; rather it should be viewed as an investment in long life and happiness. (With the stock market the way it is these days, what better investment can you make??!!)

Some Suggestions When Choosing a Pet

Now that you are armed with all of the necessary information to make you a strong advocate for universal pet ownership, here is a good series of questions that a potential pet owner (like your soon-to-be-petowning friends and family!) should first ask themselves:

pot? Is there room for a large or small dog? If you leave early and get back late or travel a lot, maybe a cat, a small mammal or a bird would be better.

What activities do you like? If you are an outdoors person who loves to hike and walk, a dog would be great.

Can you devote the time needed? Some pets require more time than others.

How much does a pet cost? The purchase price of pets varies greatly. Additionally, there may be licensing fees and veterinary costs to neuter an unaltered pet. Make sure you budget accordingly.

what sort of medical care has the pet had? Has the pet received any vaccinations or had any problems?

Once a pet has been chosen, make your purchase conditional on having a veterinarian examine the pet to ensure its good health. Not all breeders and pet stores are created equal and conditions may vary greatly.

FOOD ALLERGIES IN DOGS AND CATS

Experts suggest that 10% to 20% of all pets may exhibit some sort of allergy to food.

Additionally, approximately 1% to 6% of pets exhibit some sort of dermatitis (skin disease) allergic reaction to food making food allergy the third most common hypersensitivity skin disease in dogs and cats.

Symptoms of a Food Allergy

- Vomiting & diarrhea: All of the gastrointestinal tract can be damaged by food allergies including stomach and small bowel dysfunction and inflammation of the large intestine.
- Dermatologic (skin) reactions: Dogs usually exhibit a Pruritic (itching) dermatitis which may also be accompanied by vomiting and diarrhea. Lesions around the ears are typically shown in a quarter of all dogs with adverse food while cats usually have bumps around their head and neck.

Causes of Food Allergies

Medium to large size proteins are the primary culprits because they are viewed by the animal's immune system as being foreign bodies. Close to two-thirds of food allergies in dogs are caused by certain proteins in dairy products, beef and wheat. In cats, 90% of their allergic reactions are caused by proteins in beef, fish and dairy products.

Be Careful Where You Purchase Your Pet's Medications

Almost nightly, various channels on cable television carry advertisements from "dot coms" or give an 800 number where you can purchase a wide variety of medications for your pet ranging from heartworm preventatives to leading flea-fighting products. PLEASE BE CAREFUL! Some pet owners have undergone frightening experiences using mail order sources for these reasons:

- 1. Received medications with an expired date on the packaging! Expiration dates serve a vital purpose and out-of-date medication can lose its potency.
- Inability to ask important questions relating to the medication. Most of these sources don't have trained medical staff available to answer or assist you.
- 3. Higher than anticipated prices. Some of these sources add expensive shipping and handling charges to the invoice causing the "bottom line" cost to be much higher than anticipated and significantly higher than what local veterinary practices charge!
- 4. Lost shipments. Much needed and vital medications have gotten lost in the mail!
- 5. Receiving the wrong medication. Pet owners have complained of submitting an order and having their credit card charged only to receive the wrong item! Now the hassle of sending back the incorrect medication for credit and waiting for what is hoped to be the correct medication begins. Of course, during this waiting game, your pet is without needed medications! By comparison, our practice has been here for years and we know both you and your pet well. We won't ship the wrong medication or over-charge you. Also, we are pleased to answer any important medical questions concerning your pet. Future Birth Control Vaccine for Dogs & Cats Being Studied

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could administer a birth control medication to your pet via a simple vaccination? Research is currently being conducted on just such a medication. At present, there are still several major obstacles that must be resolved:

- Females would still have a heat cycle complete with the mess that goes with it.
- Male reproductive behavior is still intact. Dogs will still want to travel to a neighboring female dog that is in heat and male cats may still exhibit some of their aggressive behavior.
- At present, several vaccinations in a series would be required for the medication to be effective.
 This can create scheduling problems for the owner.
