2. The imaginary grid lines that circle the globe from east to west, but that measure N and S; they are parallel to each other.
3. Refers to where a place is in the world.
4. A 3-dimensional sphere, such as the earth
9. direction The names of the FOUR main directions [N, S, E, W]
12. The science of the earth's surface and its affect on physical, biological, political and cultural characteristics.
14. A map or chart maker
15. zone Local time; 24 zones around the globe to reckon standard time from Greenwich.
16. Imaginary grid lines that circle the globe, running N - S, but used to measure E or W distances; They loop the earth from the N and S poles.

1. Refers to 1/2 of the globe; it is either East or West of the Equator, or North or South of the Prime Meridian.
5. The line of latitude midway between the N and S poles; the line latitude starts from, used to measure north or south; 0°latitude
6. Meridian The longitude line that passes through Greenwich, England. It is at 0° longitude.
7. Something chosen to stand for or represent something else.
8. A system to compare actual distances and heights with those on a map or chart.
10. A description and explanation or key to a map or chart.
11. reckoning The calculating of a ship's location at sea, by log and compass, without astronomical observations.
13. An imaginary line through the North and South Poles, around which the earth revolves.
