Activity One: Internment

INDIVIDUAL REPORT

Under certain circumstances, governments restrict the civil liberties of their citizens (Civil liberties are defined as the freedom to enjoy the rights guaranteed by the constitution of the state or nation). - Response includes at least 3 reasons supporting your position as to whether or not the inhumane restrictions placed on Japanese Americans in World War 2 were justified.
- Response includes discussion of enduring effects of the restrictions placed on the civil liberties of Japanese Americans during the Second World War.
