

"According to a blog on Errata Security, 'most new printers print nearly [invisible] yellow dots that track down exactly when and where documents, any document, is printed. Because the NSA logs all printing jobs on its printers, it can use this to match up precisely who printed the document."

They were promoting their paid version which will help block ransomware, the unfortunate new way of forcing people to pay the bad guys to unlock their software after taking control of your computer. By now we have all heard of the recent attack of hospital records in the UK, and quickly spreading around the world. MalwareBytes claims that for \$40/year you can have peace of mind against

ransomware when you buy their Premium version of Malwarebytes. It is important to note that their free version **will not** protect you against ransomware. And it is also important to note that it is possible

that ransomware can infect any external backup drive you have connected to your computer. This is something that I have to think long and hard about and may consider either buying Malwarebytes premium, or changing my backup strategy to having one external drive connected 24/7 one week, then disconnect it and connect a second external drive for the following week, then start the pattern all over again. That way I always have a good backup that is not connected to my computer in the event of a ransomware attack. At the most, I will have lost one week's worth of data. The upside to all of this, however, is that Microsoft has patched any security holes in Windows, as long as you have run Windows Update and kept your computer up-todate. Also, anyone still running Windows XP should upgrade IMMEDIATELY. Despite the patching, it may be worthwhile to make sure you have a good backup and then disconnect the external drive until the next time you backup. Thanks Ross."
