• **How Do I Remove PUPs, Foistware, Drive-bys, Toolbars, and Other Annoying Things I Never Wanted?** Ask Leo, 5/3/16 “Casually from installing one download may result in several other things being installed as well. I’ll review the steps to remove these pesky, problematic, painful, Potentially Unwanted Programs, or PUPs. Ending up with random software on your machine that you never wanted in the first place is annoying. Uninstall the somewhat well-behaved PUPs using official mechanisms. What that means is that we start in Control Panel’s Programs and Features. Right-click the item you want to uninstall and click Uninstall. Run MalwareBytes. {Ask Leo recommends AdwCleaner from BleepingComputer.com Think about it before using it.} Prevention: PUPs and related pests arrive in several different ways, but the most common method is by being “offered” to you when you install something else. Often, the offer is hidden and defaulted to Yes.”

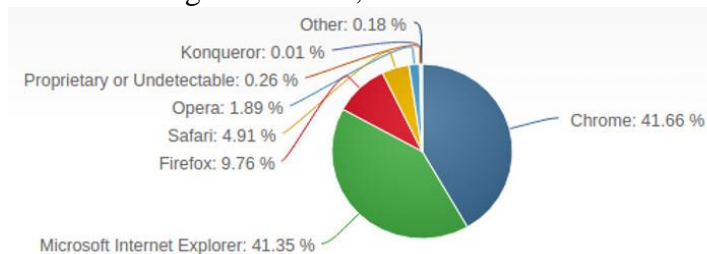
