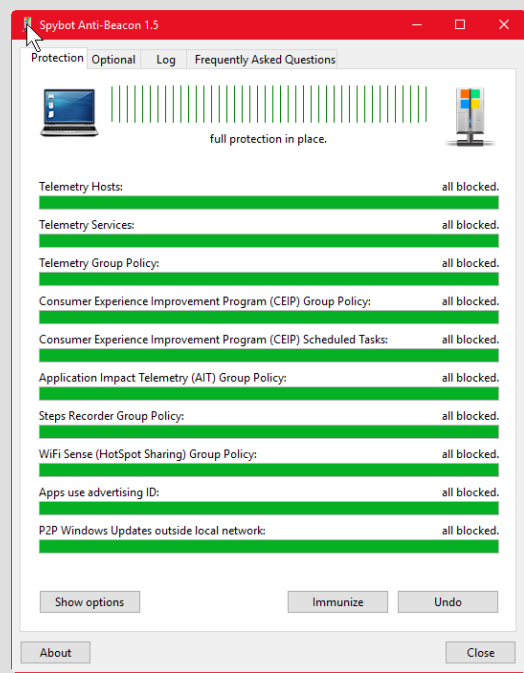
correct the privacy settings that Microsoft opened up when you upgraded to Windows 10. This is a one-time use utility that helps turn off all of the intrusive tracking options.
