E-Waste: What is e-waste? E-waste is electronic products that are unwanted, not working, and nearing or at the end of their "useful life." Examples are old computers, televisions, VCRs, stereos, copiers, and fax machines. It also includes power cords, keyboards and mice. Santa Rosa has a couple of options to get rid of your e-waste. eWaste Sonoma Computer and Electronics Recycling on South Santa Rosa avenue, although they charge to drop off certain items. You can also drop things off totally free at Santa Rosa Computers on Piner Avenue. Do not throw e-waste in your garbage or blue bins. Also, remove the hard drive from any old computers you're throwing away and have someone drill holes in it or in some fashion destroy it. Deleting your files from a drive is not the safe way of removing old data.
