There is also a browser-based Office Online suite which is free. "Office Online is great for the average Joe who just needs to make an occasional spreadsheet or word document, but it only works when you're connected to the internet..." and "lacks some important features". d) How to Tell Which Emails Quietly Track You by David Nield, 03.07.2021.

Many of the emails you receive "want to know whether the messages they send you are being opened, and there are a variety of tools available to help them do just that. A tracking pixel, embedded somewhere in the email, is how most people monitor whether an email gets opened. Tracking pixels can report the times and dates their associated email was opened, as well as the location of the device used, and the email client involved. That's a lot of data to feed back to a third-party that you might not know much about. You might not be able to do much about the use of these tracking pixels, but you can take steps to stop them from functioning, and to see which messages include them—so you know which people and which companies

are taking a particular interest in you, and you can choose who to allow and who not to." The article gives details for how to stop tracking emails for Gmail, the Mail app on macOS, and lists extensions for Chrome and Firefox that can counter act tracking pixels.

f) How to Choose How Long Your Windows 10 PC Waits Before Sleeping by Joe Fedewa, 03.10. 2021. "Windows 10 offers a few different ways to 'shut down' your PC. 'Sleep' is the most common choice, which is why you can decide how long it will take before your PC goes to sleep. Windows 10 uses sleep mode to automatically save power after your PC has been idle for a while. You can customize this time length to better suit your needs. It's easy to do." The article gives step by step instructions on how to change the sleep settings. "Keep in mind that depending on your settings in the 'Screen' section, the display may turn off before the computer goes to sleep." howtogeek.com/714871/how-to-choose-how-long

Comments from Ross:
Forgotten passwords: I forgot my password! Don't panic, it's not the end of the world. Simply open your LastPass or other password manager and find your passwords. But if you don't use a password manager and you can't find the notebook where all of your passwords are written down, you can click on the "**Forgot my password**" link on the website you're trying to log into. When you click the link, you will get a code or temporary password sent to your Inbox or a text will be sent to your smartphone, if you have one. That code or temp password can only be used once so don't worry about saving the email or text. Go back to the website that you're having trouble logging into, enter your one-time only code or temp password and you should be prompted to enter a new password. Remember, don't use simple passwords like 12345678 or Password123. It helps to include numbers and characters, for example 1 or ! or @.
