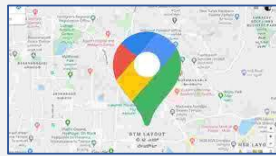

**a) Use Hotmail or Outlook? You might have to start paying for it** by Charlie Fripp, 02.03.21. "Microsoft retired the Hotmail brand and renamed it Outlook in 2012. Everybody on the system was automatically switched over to Microsoft Outlook back in 2013, and it has been impossible to create a Hotmail account since." It turns out that this switch from Hotmail to Outlook did not carryover the 15GB limit on mailboxes. "Realizing the error, Microsoft has now slapped over-the-limit users with an ultimatum: delete your emails or pay up. Until you decide, you will be unable to send or receive messages in your Hotmail inbox. If the inbox is your primary way of communication, you're faced with a conundrum. You can either sift through (possibly) years of emails, or you can pay \$80 a year for a premium Office 365 subscription." Read the article

**b) The Framework Laptop is fully modular — and it looks incredible** by Chuong Nguyen, 02.25.21. "On the surface, with its attractive machined aluminum shell and sleek design, the Framework Laptop looks similar to a MacBook Pro or a Surface Laptop. In addition to standard upgrades, like the SSD and RAM modules that can be replaced on some Windows notebooks today, you will also be able to upgrade the ports, Wi-Fi module, screen, keyboard, battery, and even the entire motherboard with each successive generation of silicon released by companies like Intel. The modular concept that Framework is using on its notebook allows this laptop to not only be highly upgradable and serviceable but also keep aging electronics out of landfills. ### Comments from Ross:

**Restoring files:** By now we are all backing up our documents and pictures to either an external drive or a cloud-based service, **right?** But have you ever **tested** your backup to see if you can restore a file? If the answer is no, then I suggest you take a minute to learn how to restore a file from your backup drive. If you're using Windows Backup, tap the start button, type restore files, look for the file you want to restore, click Restore. If you're using Cobian, click File Explorer (yellow file folder on task bar), double click your external drive, find the file you want to restore, and drag it to your documents folder. If you're using a cloud-based service such as OneDrive, open your browser and log into your OneDrive account, choose the Recycle bin, find the file you want to restore and click Restore. Consult Google for instructions on how to restore files using whatever backup method you're using. Don't assume your backup software is working, test it.
