Here's an alternative that will allow you to keep the drive in the PC. Use a program called KillDisk. Download the file from killdisk.com, double click it to install it, start the program and click on Local Disk C, click the Erase Disk button and then the Start button. Restart the computer after it's done and everything will be gone--no files, not even Windows. The drive will be empty.
