calendar. While this is convenient, it may also feel uncomfortable to know your messages are being analyzed. Your data can be used to target you with ads. It can be shared with other companies or even sold. Your browsing habits can track you across websites as companies build a profile of you." The article reviews gmail, yahoo mail and outlook. Restart the computer after it's done and everything will be gone--no files, not even Windows. The drive will be empty.
