

Things are going to get worse

Welcome to 2009. As you may be aware, circumstances for everyone will be undergoing changes. But perhaps we can use this as an opportunity to learn just how much we have really learned about the Buddha dharma. By that, I mean how much have we really incorporated the lessons of the dharma into how we act, what we think, and what we perceive.

The Buddha told a story of how the maid of a rich widow, who had the reputation of being kind, modest and courteous, revealed the real truth of the woman's true character.

> Once there was a rich widow who had a reputation for kindness. modesty and courtesy. She had a housemaid who was wise and diligent.

> One day the maid thought: "My mistress has a very good reputation; I wonder whether she is good by nature, or is good because of her surroundings. I will try her and find out.

> The following morning the maid did not appear before her mistress until nearly noon. The mistress was vexed and scolded her impatiently. The maid replied: "If I am lazy for only a day or two, you ought not to become impatient." Then the mistress became

Report on Amida's Family Gathering "Honoring Shinran Shonin"

The 3rd Bay District Family Conference was held on Saturday, November 8, 2008, at the Palo Alto Buddhist Temple. About 285 people of all ages attended from grandchildren to grandparents. There were inspiring speakers, activities, discussion groups and lots of fun. It was a wonderful gathering that was enjoyed by all. The theme was "Amida's Family Gathering, Honoring Shinran Shonin". The conference began the Bay District's commemoration of Shinran Shonin's 750th Memorial. Starting in 2008, many events will be held in conjunction with honoring Shrinran Shonin. The celebrations will culminate in Kyoto for his 750th Memorial Service in May 2011.

There were three from Enmanji who attended: Dr. Kent Matsuda, Helen Kobayashi and Keiko Furusho. We all drove together. We arrived in Palo Alto at 9:00 am in time for the registration and to relax and visit before starting the day's schedule.

Susan Bottari and Chiz Kakiuchi were co-chairpersons for the conference. The Opening Service began at 9:45 am. The organist was Steve Terusaki (Mr. & Mrs. Kameoka's son-in-law). The Bay District Council President, Victor Iwamura, gave a welcome speech. Rev. Ron Kobata, BCA, gave a message honoring Shinran Shonin.

After a short break, everyone broke up to go to Session I. There would be 4 sessions throughout the day, with many groups doing different things according to age and interest. From the dharma school to the high school groups, and the Japanese speaker (Rev. George Matsubayashi) group, the comments were good. There were two adult English speakers: Rev. David Matsumoto and Rev. Patricia Usuki. were extraordinary. Rev. Matsumoto stressed the importance of bringing religion into family life. He depicted Shinran & his family as real people. Simple. ordinary we too can live the Nembutsu Path. We must go beyond the problems of life. He mentions living life with the three A's, awareness, authenticity and appreciation.

After a delicious homemade donburi lunch, we were all led in a group exercise. Rev. Zuikei Taniguchi led us in the lively Rajio Taiso. In Session II, Rev. Usuki spoke of the big 750th celebration. She feels that Shinran would not want to be celebrated, because he was so humble and down to earth. One must look within each self and appreciate what we have. The level of satisfaction decreases as materialism increases. Society will transform when it reflects and realizes it has everything it needs within its own self to be happy.

Session III was a discussion with both Rev. Matsumoto and Rev. Usuki. It was good and very interesting. Many different people asked questions or had comments. One lady thanked Rev. Usuki for her psychological explanations. Another wanted Rev. Matsumoto's view on abortion. Proposition 8 was discussed. Dharma & politics they said are ok.....can reflect but cannot pronounce. Compassion, meditation, mindfulness were other topics that were brought up. It was a very good discussion workshop. Afterwards, Session IV was a workshop on composing gathas.

We tried to write verses to fit the music that was being played with a guitar. It was suppose to be light & fun. I thought it was a little difficult, but Helen really liked it. She would like to bring the ideas back to Enmanji.

The Closing Service introduced Rev. Seigen Yamaoka and Rev. Eijun Kujo. Both gave dharma talks that were good and funny in parts. They both will be retiring from the Bay District and were presented with recognition gifts. The conference was over, and we got delicious obentos. We all ate together and had our last visits and good-byes. It was the end of a most exhilarating day.

late again. This made the mistress very angry and she struck the maid with a stick. This incident became widely known and the rich widow lost her good reputation.

Many people are like this woman. While their surroundings are satisfactory they are kind, modest and quiet, but it is questionable if they will behave likewise when the conditions change and become unsatisfactory.

It is only when a person maintains a pure and peaceful mind and continues to act with goodness when unpleasant words enter his ears, when others show ill-will toward him or when he lacks sufficient food, clothes and shelter, that we may call him good.

Therefore, those who do good deeds and maintain a peaceful mind only

when their surroundings are satisfactory are not really good people. Only those who have received the Buddha's teachings and are training their minds and bodies by those teachings can be called truly good, modest and peaceful people.

(1 MN 2-21, Kakacupama-sutta)

With the drastic changes going on in the world today, it looks like we are all going to have the opportunity to test our own reputations of "goodness." Dharma works in wondrously strange ways, but nembutsu works in just one way – to reveal our true nature and show why the Buddha has given us 'namo amida butsu.' As nembutsu followers we should be used to and value the self-revelation associated with unfavorable circumstances. Maybe this is the greatest gift nembutsu can teach to the world at this time. namoamidabutsu.
